



## **GENTS SUPPLEMENTARY SCORES**

The CONGU UHS 2008-2011 allows eligible members of affiliated golf clubs to return Supplementary Scores for handicapping purposes. A Supplementary Score is a score in compliance with Clause 21 of the UHS, returned for handicapping purposes, other than in a Qualifying Competition. The objectives and conditions under which Supplementary Scores can be submitted are as follows:

### **Objectives:**

To provide additional opportunities for members to return qualifying scores to maintain a handicap that reasonably reflects their current ability, who:

- Cannot regularly participate in Club competitions due to work or family commitments
- Cannot obtain, on a regular basis, an acceptable starting time on competition days in clubs with a large playing membership
- Have a declining desire to play regular competitive golf

### **Who is eligible to submit Supplementary Scores?**

Players in all handicap categories are eligible to submit Supplementary Scores.

### **Conditions:**

The following conditions for the submission of Supplementary Scores apply:

- A *Supplementary Score* may only be returned at the "Home" club of the Player.
- An acceptable score for *Supplementary Score* purposes is any authenticated score, other than in a Qualifying Competition, returned under Stroke Play conditions over a measured course e.g. the score can be returned from Forward or Yellow tees provided that a Standard Scratch Score has been allocated by the Scottish Golf Union.
- A maximum of 10 *Supplementary Scores* may be returned per annum. Supplementary Scores are limited to one per week, unless your golf club decides otherwise.
- A Player intending to return a *Supplementary Score* is required to signify his intention prior to the commencement of play, in the manner determined by your Golf Club.
- No CSS will be calculated, and adjustments to handicap (up or down), shall be made in relation to the SSS, in accordance with Clause 20.6.
- Stroke Play returns returned will be subject to Clause 19 (*Stableford/Nett Double Bogey*) adjustment.
- The *Supplementary Score* must be recorded in the Player Handicap Record.
- If a Player who has registered for a Supplementary Score subsequently does not return a scorecard an increase in handicap of 0.1 will be applied.
- Returns will be subject to Clause 23 (B) application if 'manipulation' is suspected.
- Players recently allocated a CONGU<sup>®</sup> Handicap qualify immediately for the return of Supplementary Scores.
